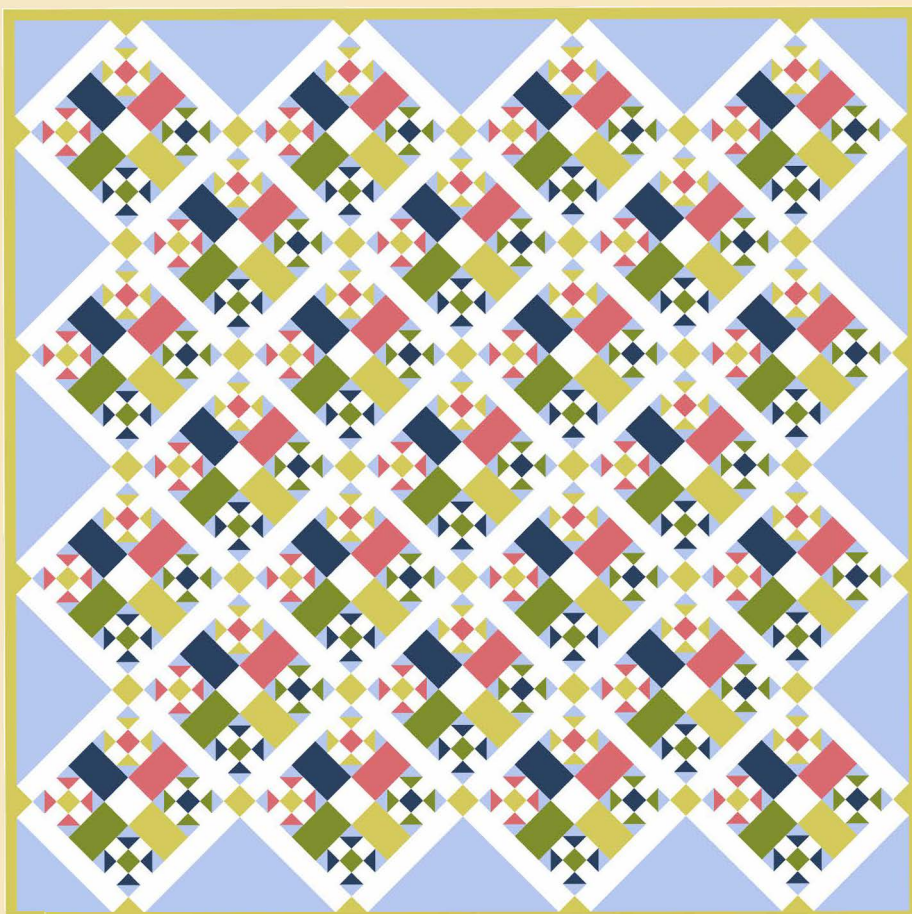

December 2026 will bring the release of two very different Bryn Mawr Quilts™ patterns—one bright, playful, and contemporary, and the other filled with warmth and holiday nostalgia.



DON'T FEED THE ANIMALS

Featuring Century Solids from Andover Fabrics

Bold color, playful geometry, and unexpected movement come together in *Don't Feed the Animals*, an 81¼" × 81¼" quilt created using Century Solids from Andover Fabrics.

The repeating blocks are set on point, creating a woven lattice effect that carries the eye across the design. Navy, coral, olive green, golden yellow, soft blue, and crisp white give the quilt a cheerful, modern personality while still feeling familiar and approachable.

Century Solids gave this design exactly what it needed. The rich, dependable colors allow every shape and secondary pattern to remain clear, while the variety of shades adds depth without overwhelming the composition.

The complete *Don't Feed the Animals* pattern will be available for purchase in December 2026. This quilt will also have a special place in our upcoming *Inspired! By Color* journey, with more details to come.

PAPER POINSETTIAS

Featuring Cottage Cloth by Renee Nanneman of Need'l Love for Andover Fabrics

After many requests, the pattern for *Paper Poinsettias*, measuring 73" × 94", will finally be available in December 2026.

This warm and welcoming quilt reimagines the traditional poinsettia as a beautifully pieced geometric bloom. The woven centers and layered points give each flower dimension, while the changing shades make the quilt feel timeless, collected, and full of character.

The quilt was created using *Cottage Cloth*, designed by my dear friend Renee Nanneman of Need'l Love for Andover Fabrics. *Cottage Cloth* brings a softly aged richness to the project, giving the colors the appearance of fabrics that have been lovingly gathered over time.

The deep red background creates a dramatic setting for poinsettias in creamy white, olive green, soft gray, and muted gold. A charming red-and-cream pieced border finishes the quilt with just the right touch of vintage holiday nostalgia.

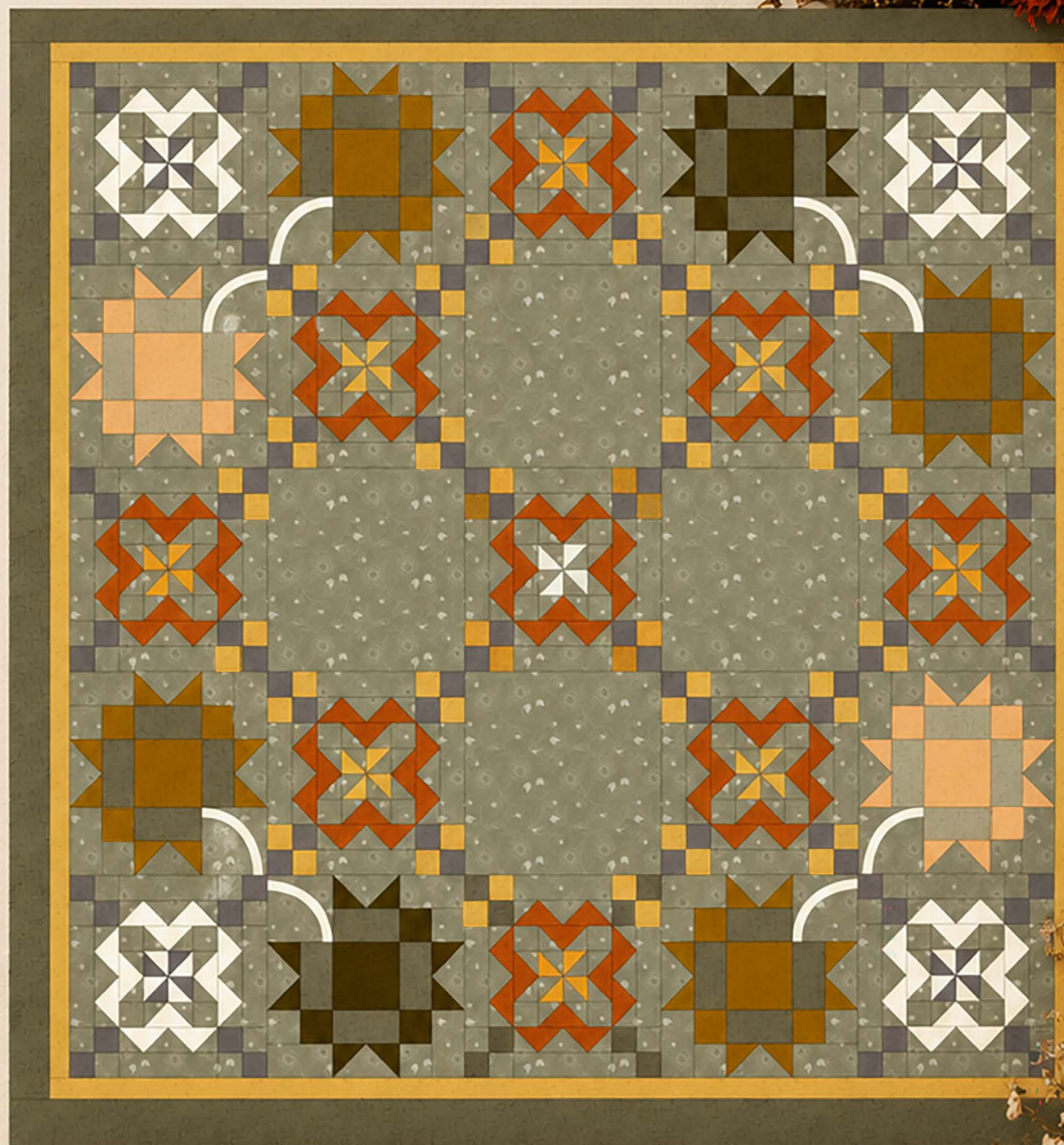
There is a special kind of beauty

The softly textured fabrics give the
quilt depth and warmth, while allowing
the autumnal palette to feel aged,
collected, and comfortably familiar.

will not be available until 2027, but
I wanted to give you an early look
at a project that is quickly becoming
one of my favorites.

More than just a collection, *Sparrow Falls* is a collection of memories—transformed into fabric. I can't wait to see how it becomes part of your stories, stitched into quilts, pillows, and treasured keepsakes for years to come.

THE SCANT QUARTER INCH

A Quilter's Guide to a Fake Measurement

For generations, quilters have debated the mysterious scant quarter-inch seam. How scant should it be? Is it one thread narrower than a quarter inch? One needle click? The width of a pencil line?

Here is my honest opinion: the scant quarter inch is not a real, quantifiable unit of measurement.

You cannot find a scant quarter inch marked on a ruler. It is not a consistent fraction that measures the same for every quilter. What we call a scant quarter inch is actually a technique used to help our finished patchwork come out at the correct size.

The need for that adjustment comes from a simple fact: not every quarter-inch seam is created equal.

Your sewing machine, presser foot, needle position, thread weight, fabric thickness, cutting accuracy, and pressing method can all affect the finished measurement of a block. Even the tiny fold created when a seam is pressed takes up a small amount of fabric.

That means two quilters can both sew directly along a quarter-inch guide and still end up with slightly different results.

Rather than chasing someone else's idea of a scant quarter inch, I believe every quilter should calibrate the seam allowance that works for their own machine and materials.



★ FIND YOUR ACCURATE SEAM ★

- 1 Cut three rectangles measuring $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 5''$.
 - 2 Sew them together along their 5" edges using your usual quarter-inch seam allowance. Press the seams exactly as you would for your quilt.
 - 3 Your completed unit should measure 7" wide.
- Less than 7" means your seam allowance is slightly too wide.
 - More than 7" means your seam allowance is slightly too narrow.
 - Exactly 7" means you have found the correct setting for that fabric, thread, and pressing method.

Adjust your needle position one small step at a time and repeat the test until the unit finishes correctly. Once you find the setting, write it down and use it consistently throughout the project.

Your accurate seam may be a true quarter inch. It may be one needle click narrower. It may even change when you switch to heavier thread or thicker fabric.

The goal is not to sew a mythical measurement.

The goal is to make accurate patchwork.

"Consistency matters more than what we call the measurement."

3 RECTANGLES JOINED = 7 INCH UNIT

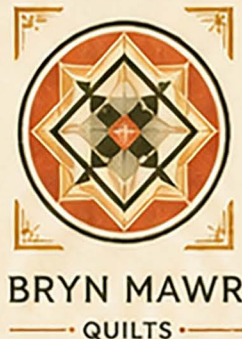

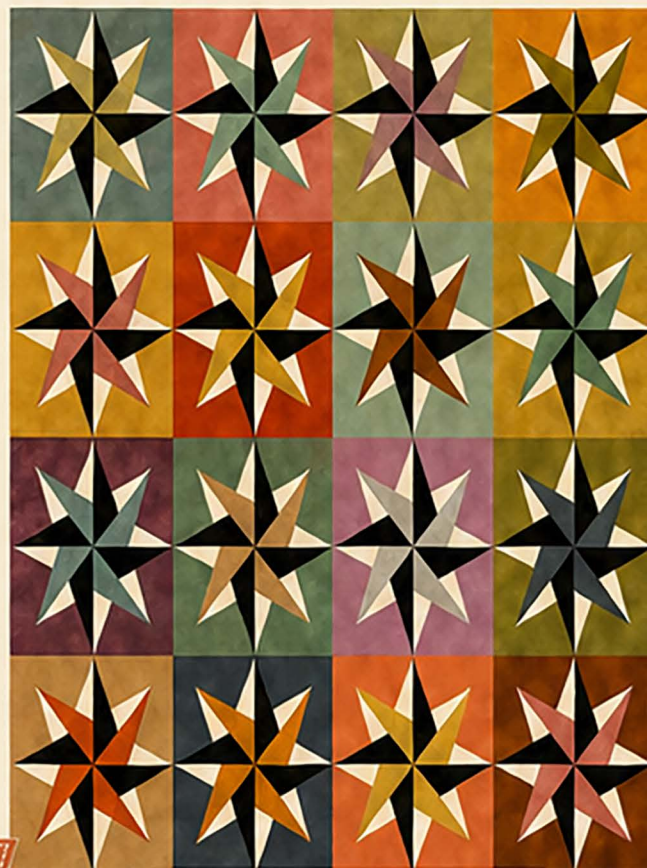
1. The Sewcial Club Quilt Retreat
